Dakota County Soil & Water Conservation District Anticipating Another Year of Record Participation in Landscaping for Clean Water Program

Dakota County, MN – The Dakota County Soil & Water Conservation District, a local government unit, is a resource for those interesting in partnering for soil and water conservation.

One of their programs for Dakota County residents is the *Landscaping for Clean Water* program, which includes free educational workshops, hands-on design classes, assistance at site visits, and grants for homeowners. The goal of the Landscaping for Clean Water program is to teach residents how to beautify their yards while also protecting local water quality and providing habitat for pollinators.

These goals seem to resonate with Dakota County residents: participation in this program has been skyrocketing over the past two years. In 2018, the number of raingardens and native pollinator gardens installed through the grant program was 33% higher than in 2017 and 74% higher than in 2016.

Registration is now open for the 2019 introductory workshops (residents must attend one of these to gain access to the hands-on design courses and reimbursement grants.) Many courses are expected to sell out this year, so pre-registration is important. Workshops are open to anyone, no matter where they live. The public can learn more and register online at the Dakota SWCD website: dakotaswcd.org/cleanwater.html.
