We Are Water Exhibit Shares Water Stories and Water Solutions

We might think we know a lot about water in the Land of 10,000 Lakes, but a few minutes at the *We Are Water* Exhibit currently at the Weitz Center (320 Third Street East) in Northfield, shows you how much there is to know about the rivers, lakes, and drinking water that we depend upon.

This 1,000 square foot exhibit is hosted by the Cannon River Watershed Partnership and the Weitz Center for Creativity at Carleton College. The panels and activities help us see how humans depend upon water for drinking, growing crops, washing, and for recreation (fishing, swimming, boating, canoeing). But don't think this exhibit is going to be like schoolwork. This state-of-the-art exhibit uses video, computer game simulations, puppets, puzzles, and hands-on activities to show us how important water is to all of us. It also shows us what we need to do individually and as citizens and voters to make sure that our rivers, lakes, and drinking water gets cleaner and stays safe.

"One thing that I really like about *We Are Water* is how it shows us the many ways that water is important to all of us and it shows us what we can do to keep the Cannon River healthy for our communities and our families to enjoy," said CRWP Executive Director Kristi Pursell.

In addition to science information, the exhibit gives visitors a chance to share their own water story and to listen to recorded water stories from are residents. The Weitz Center as also installed a art exhibit entitled *Fluid: Water Inspired Work from the Carleton Art Collection* adjacent to the *We Are Water* exhibit.
