MORAVCHIK ANNOUNCES BID FOR DISTRICT 20B

LONSDALE, MN — Lonsdale resident Joe Moravchik announced this week that he will seek the Republican endorsement for MN House District 20B. There are now two candidates seeking the endorsement.

"With so much uncertainty because of the coronavirus, we need proven leadership in state government. I will be a strong advocate for workers and small business, mindful of budgets, and an independent voice of reason for what is best for our district and our state," Moravchik said.

Moravchik is a proven leader. He is a former coach, teacher, and law enforcement officer, who sustained an on-duty injury, which forced his early retirement from police work.
