RE: "Supplemental Agenda Background Memo" for July 7, 2020 No. 2.

Summary Report:

The following is an update on agenda items as supplemental background agenda information made available for Tuesday, July 7, 2020.

Item 16. 20-348 Consider Requirement of Face Coverings for Indoor City Facilities.

Recommended Action

City Administrator Martig recommends Council consider a motion directing City Administrator Martig to implement a requirement for face coverings be required in public spaces for City owned and operated indoor facilities.

Background

City staff is having discussions about detailed implementation options should the Council choose to direct a requirement for facial coverings in public spaces for City owned and operated indoor facilities.

The facilities that would be included in this includes City Hall (DMV customers and other), municipal liquor store, library (currently required), police station, pool locker room areas, Ice Arena (inside the building but not on the ice), and public works maintenance building. Since the City does not oversee operations at the Fire Station and NCRC Building those would not be included in the action.

There would be some cases where there would likely be exceptions to the implementation such as elections at City Hall where we are not allowed under State law to mandate wearing of face coverings. Additionally, there would likely be other exceptions such as people who have medical conditions.

Financial Impact

If the action passes, the implementation would expect to include providing facial covering masks should people need them. This is being done at the library currently for the public and staff. The cost is estimated to be between \$.95 and \$1.38 for each mask depending on the disposable type we'd use. We do have a supply of masks that have been provided by Rice County and also may have access to some donated masks that may be of use as well.

We anticipate that these would be eligible expenses for FEMA or CARES act reimbursement. However, we are working to verify this further.

Alternative Options

- A. If the City Council would like more detail on the implementation before acting on a motion staff would recommending a motion to postpone to July 21st and we'd have the actual written policies and more details on implementation.
- B. Council could choose not to direct this implementation at this time.

Timeline

We do not currently have an implementation timeline but would work to prepare the details including policies, education, signage and materials. City Administrator Martig would update Council as details come forward.

Deb, City Staff, Mayor Pownell and Council Members:

First, a quick Thank You for all your hard work during this crazy time. We need excellent leadership more than ever, and we appreciate your efforts at guiding our fair city through this time of crisis.

We've been hearing rumblings regarding a city ordinance requiring folks to wear masks in public. In many ways, we are for this plan. However, we have several concerns about the specifics and execution of said plan. Perhaps you already have something in mind that would address these questions, or can use another city's ordinance as a template; either way, we appreciate good research and discussion and input from the community and businesses as you all figure out the specifics. We probably don't need to stress the importance of addressing specific aspects of the policies within the ordinance, but wanted to be sure that the following items are under consideration:

- Who will enforce? It seems probable that this would fall to business owners and staff, at least as a first tier of educating the public, especially if the rule is intended for indoor spaces. Obviously business owners need to buy-in. We at Imminent are already encouraging folks to wear masks anytime they are not at their table, and we are OK with educating folks about an ordinance if need be. However, we have a LOT on our minds and plates already, so having some guidance about HOW the city would like business owners to do this would be very welcome. Particularly, if someone outright refuses to wear one -- what are we expected to do? While we aren't keen on having these individuals enter our business, there are two big issues that bother us about this: one, we can't put ourselves or our employees in harm's way -- People are tense right now and we don't want the added responsibility of dealing with belligerent people (we are greatly trying to reduce this possibility in other ways, too). Secondly, there are some people who are medically unable to wear masks -- I'll come back to this.

- How will the ordinance be enforced? In other words - what are the consequences for not wearing one? We urge that individuals will be responsible, and not have businesses bear the consequences for anyone choosing not to wear one.

- On a similar note, we are highly encouraging reservations and specify in a number of communications that masks are encouraged (if necessary we will change this to required). However, we're still surprised at the number of people who walk up without their masks and have done no scouting of the rules or requirements at our place. Is there a way that the city can help businesses with the burden (financial and otherwise) of communications (signage, etc.) as well as having disposable masks available so that we won't have to turn people away if they haven't brought a mask? This might be a long shot, but we wanted to see if it's possible.

- Similarly -- how does the city plan to communicate this information? Are there specific ways that businesses can cooperate in "marketing" this plan with a consistent message?

- What are the specific requirements and considerations for restaurants and bars, as opposed to

retail spots? At Imminent, and several other places we've been, it's been working pretty well to ask folks to stay at their tables unless they need to order or use the restroom, and we've asked them to wear masks any time they need to get up from their table.

- Finally, we're trying to approach the whole mask-wearing situation with empathy. It's true that many people choose not to wear masks because they believe it impedes their freedom, or perhaps they are making a political statement, or whatever the case may be. But, there are also people out there who are unable to wear a mask, whether for a medical or health reason, including those related to mental health. During our discussion on whether we should require masks at Imminent, a tragic and terrifying example was given that altered the way I think about this situation: a person was suffering with PTSD-type symptoms after being assaulted, and couldn't bear to have something covering their mouth and nose. I realized that anyone who has that sort of valid reason not to wear a mask is being re-traumatized every single time someone asks them to wear one --furthermore, they are being judged as being selfish and uncaring about others. We don't think it's right to ask strangers to have to rehash their medical or personal history in order to let them into our space. So instead of requiring masks, we chose to make it a request, and we try to assume that anyone choosing not to wear one may be doing so for a valid reason (rather than assuming that EVERY person not wearing one is an asshole. Even though we know there's no shortage of assholes out there). Anyway, the question is: what provisions can be made for these individuals to be safe and feel safe without marking them with a scarlet letter, so to speak? True, these people may be "self-selecting" to stay home or do curbside pickup instead of walking into businesses. But still: how can the city help communicate that there are necessary exceptions to the rule, and encourage businesses and citizens to be compassionate about these situations, though they may be rare? Yesterday, I noticed that Family Fare's posted sign reads something like: "If you are medically able to wear a mask, we request that you do so while in our store." Excellent verbiage, in my opinion! We agree that wearing masks prevents the spread of the virus; thus, this is a public health issue. We also believe that the mental health and well-being of everyone around us is a public health issue. We hope we can find ways to keep folks safe that are trauma-informed and that do not isolate those who may already be struggling with their state of mind.

Safety is our utmost priority right now at Imminent: possibly to a fault -- some of the measures we're taking seem extreme to some people (though we've received more compliments than complaints). We are operating at far less than 50% of our normal capacity, frankly, because of these precautions (e.g., requiring/pushing advanced reservations and allowing minimal walk-ups, utilizing seating times to reduce overlap between customers and allow for cleaning breaks between customers). We are as concerned about all of these measures as wearing masks, though we could probably attract more revenue if we eased restrictions. Many Northfield businesses we've seen are doing a great job, but others are rumored to be making minimal attempts at these precautions. If we are not all making sacrifices for the greater good, we all stand to lose -- this goes for all sorts of precautions, including masks. If other businesses are not going to take protocols seriously, then we all stand to lose out if we have to close down again if/when the number of Covid cases spikes. What else can the city do to encourage citizens and businesses to take this seriously?

We deeply understand that this is all a great challenge -- it's one we're facing every day when we open our doors. In the end, we do believe that there are many good reasons to pass an ordinance, and we do lean slightly towards that outcome and thus encourage you all to act accordingly. But things are rarely simple or black-and-white, and we hope that you'll take all of these considerations, and more, into account as you engage in discussion and craft the

specific language around this policy.

Thank you again for your time and your efforts at keeping our citizens safe, healthy, and well.



Northfield Face Mask Ordinance

As we continue to experience the devastating effects of the Covid-19 pandemic, and as scientists continue to understand better ways in which we can protect ourselves against infection, it has become clear that wearing cloth face coverings (masks) in indoor public places is one of the most effective preventative measures we can take. Yet many people are still hesitant or unwilling to wear masks, even in public indoor spaces where the risks of transmission are much greater.

We urge the Northfield City Council to pass an ordinance requiring the wearing of cloth face coverings in indoor public places in Northfield until the danger of the pandemic has ended through the development of a vaccine or other means. In order for masks to be effective in stopping the spread of Covid-19, everyone has to wear them. We need to make wearing a mask normal, expected, non-political, and simply—as it should be—an indication of our commitment to the health and welfare of our entire community.

How to Wear Cloth Face Coverings

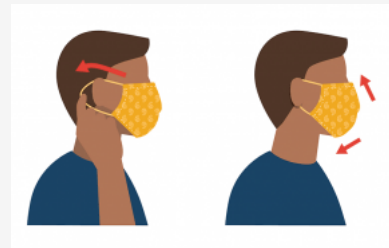

Cloth face coverings are an additional step to help slow the spread of COVID-19 when combined with [every day preventive actions](#) and [social distancing](#) in public settings.

- **Who should NOT use cloth face coverings:** children under age 2, or anyone who has trouble breathing, is unconscious, incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.
- **Cloth face coverings are NOT surgical masks or N95 respirators.** Currently, surgical masks and N95 respirators are critical supplies that should be reserved for healthcare workers and other first responders.

Wear your Face Covering Correctly

- Wash your hands before putting on your face covering
- Put it over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin
- Try to fit it snugly against the sides of your face
- Make sure you can breathe easily

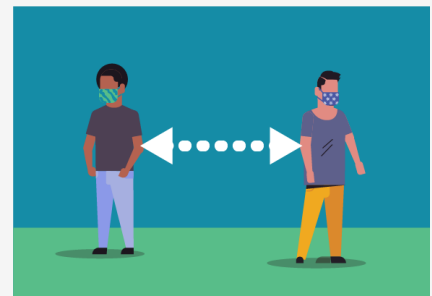


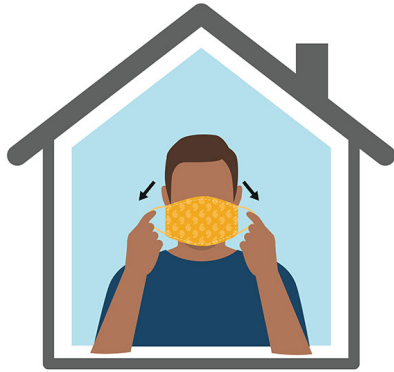
Use the Face Covering to Protect Others

- Wear a face covering to help protect others in case you're infected but don't have symptoms
- Wear the covering in public settings when around people outside of your household, especially when other [social distancing](#) measures are difficult to maintain
- **Don't** put the covering around your neck or up on your forehead
- **Don't** touch the face covering, and, if you do, wash your hands

Follow Everyday Health Habits

- Stay at least 6 feet away from others
- Avoid contact with people who are sick
- Wash your hands often, with soap and water, for at least 20 seconds each time
- Use hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available





Take Off Your Cloth Face Covering Carefully, When You're Home

- Untie the strings behind your head or stretch the ear loops
- Handle only by the ear loops or ties
- Fold outside corners together
- Place covering in the washing machine (learn more about [how to wash cloth face coverings](#))
- Be careful not to touch your eyes, nose, and mouth when removing and wash hands immediately after removing.

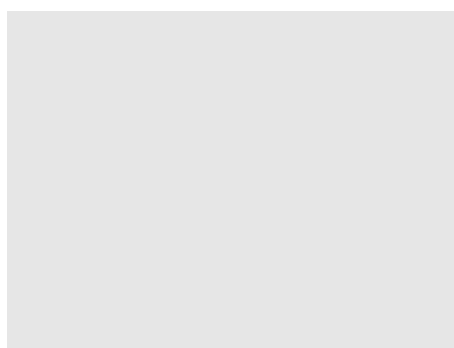

Hospital officials: patient numbers on the rise, danger to organization persists

Although patient visits are increasing substantially at Northfield Hospital and Clinics, officials and board members say the pandemic is still severely hampering the organization and could pose even greater risks in the future.

According to numbers presented during the June 25 hospital board meeting, total visits in recent weeks have returned to about 85% of normal, in a pre-COVID 19 budget. Video visits continue, but are at about half of peak levels. Surgeries increased last month to 78% of normal, a drastic increase from 32% earlier in the pandemic.

Hospital President/CEO Steve Underdahl attributes those increases to pent-up patient demand as some needed surgeries and elective procedures were delayed for weeks as patients stayed away to help combat the spread of the virus.

Board Chair Steve O'Neill said although the increase in patient volumes "is an encouraging sign," year-to-date patient volumes are still much lower than pre-COVID 19 projections.

"As reopening hospital and clinic services continues, NH+C is taking a cautious, measured and vigilant approach, keeping the health and safety of our patients and staff as its highest priority," he said Monday in an email.

In Northfield, the hospital is open except for the Express Care Clinic and Urgent Care Clinic.

"We're being intentional about when and how we reopen Urgent Care and Express Care so they don't become walk-in respiratory clinics by default," Underdahl said late last week in an email. "In the meantime, we can care for people who need urgent or quick care at our primary care clinics, and the emergency department."

Visitor guidelines continue to evolve, with nursing home visits still being the most restricted due to the disproportionate toll COVID-19 is having on people over the age of 65 and those with pre-existing conditions. That has sparked sadness from family members who can't spend time with their loved ones, but Underdahl said patients and their families are devising creative ways to interact, including speaking to each other every day via telephone and by using iPads.

Screening for guests and staff continues to be refined. Hospital staff grapple with maintaining that safety precaution while not making the process too onerous. Visitors fill out a form to ensure they are not sick, and then temperatures are taken via facial recognition technology to ensure there is no fever present.

Although Underdahl said the \$6.4 million the hospital has received in state and federal grants to combat losses caused by COVID-19 is "helpful," he noted that shouldn't be interpreted as eliminating the financial challenges the hospital continues to face, and instead makes the situation appear better than what it is.

"Given that there are so many unknowns related to the pandemic, I can't speculate on when the financial situation will improve for NH+C or other hospitals and clinics," O'Neill said. "Some states that were doing relatively well in managing the spread of the virus are now experiencing significant spikes in reported cases and hospitalizations."

Temporary salary reductions, furloughs expected to continue

NH+C is expected to address temporary salary reductions and furloughs by the end of the year. On April 8, the organization announced senior staff and directors would take a 10% pay cut and that some staff would be placed on temporary leaves of absence.

The possibility of the hospital reaching out to care centers and other facilities to help them purchase technology to protect residents and patients was discussed Thursday. The hospital is aiming for in-house tests to start by July 6.

To prevent any surge that could cost lives and NH+C even more financially, board chair O'Neill called for residents to wear a mask in public, socially distance, stay home when sick and wash hands frequently.

"I believe NH+C has done an outstanding job, in an incredibly difficult time, in managing the extreme challenges in navigating our finances and patient care," he said. "Our community is fortunate to have such a committed team of staff and medical providers who are dedicated to patient health and safety."

Hospitals across the region are gearing up as restrictions meant to slow the spread of COVID-19 wind down.

Mayo Clinic announced last week it was ending pay cuts imposed to deal with the patient downturn. According to the Star Tribune, Mayo plans to restore pay and return furloughed workers this summer.

In April, Mayo announced plans to cut pay to more than 20,000 people and seek furloughs when elective surgeries were halted in anticipation of a surge in COVID-19 patients. The clinic was projecting a possible \$3 billion loss in 2020. But Mayo says

patient volumes reached 80% to 90% of normal by mid-June, which was a quicker-than-expected recovery.

Considerations for Wearing Cloth Face Coverings

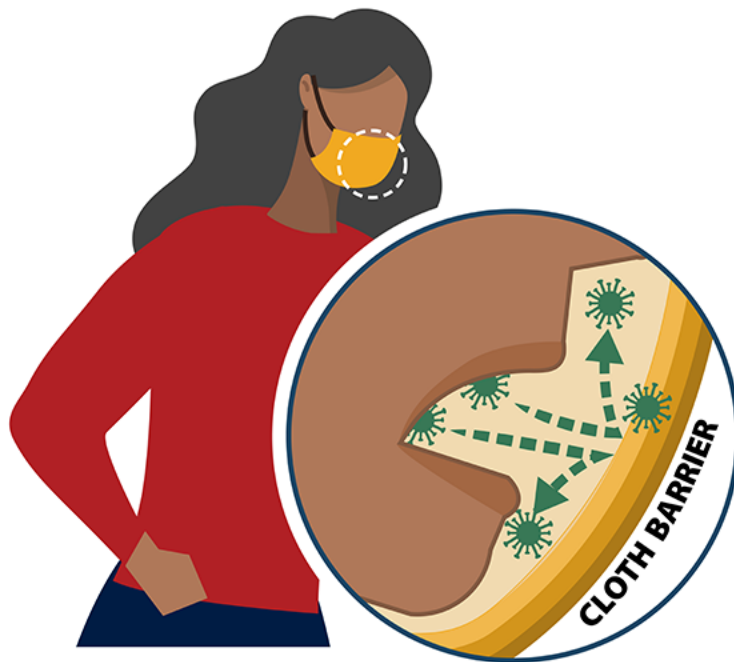
Help Slow the Spread of COVID-19

- CDC recommends that people wear cloth face coverings in public settings and when around people who don't live in your household, especially when other [social distancing](#) measures are difficult to maintain.
- Cloth face coverings may help prevent people who have COVID-19 from spreading the virus to others.
- Cloth face coverings are most likely to reduce the spread of COVID-19 when they are widely used by people in public settings.
- Cloth face coverings should NOT be worn by children under the age of 2 or anyone who has trouble breathing, is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.

Evidence for Effectiveness of Cloth Face Coverings



Cloth face coverings are recommended as a simple barrier to help prevent respiratory droplets from traveling into the air and onto other people when the person wearing the cloth face covering coughs, sneezes, talks, or raises their voice. This is called source control. This recommendation is based on what we know about the role respiratory droplets play in the spread of the virus that causes COVID-19, paired with [emerging evidence](#) from clinical and laboratory studies that shows cloth face coverings reduce the spray of droplets when worn over the nose and mouth. COVID-19 spreads mainly among people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet), so the use of cloth face coverings is particularly important in settings where people are close to each other or where social distancing is difficult to maintain.

Who Should Wear A

Cloth Face Covering?

General public

- CDC recommends all people 2 years of age and older wear a cloth face covering in public settings and when around people who don't live in your household, especially when other [social distancing](#) measures are difficult to maintain.
- COVID-19 can be spread by people who do not have symptoms and do not know that they are infected. That's why it's important for everyone to wear cloth face coverings in public settings and practice [social distancing](#) (staying at least 6 feet away from other people).
- While cloth face coverings are strongly encouraged to reduce the spread of COVID-19, CDC recognizes there are specific instances when wearing a cloth face covering may not be feasible. In these instances, [adaptations and](#)

[alternatives](#) should be considered whenever possible (see below for examples).

People who know or think they might have COVID-19

- If you are sick with COVID-19 or think you might have COVID-19, do not visit public areas. Stay home except to get medical care. As much as possible stay in a specific room and away from other people and [pets](#) in your home. If you need to be around other people or animals, wear a cloth face covering (including in your home).
- The cloth face covering helps prevent a person who is sick from spreading the virus to others. It helps keep respiratory droplets contained and from reaching other people.

Caregivers of people with COVID-19

- Those caring for someone who is sick with COVID-19 at home or in a non-healthcare setting may also wear a cloth face covering. However, the protective effects—how well the cloth face covering protects healthy people from breathing in the virus—are unknown. To prevent getting sick, caregivers should also continue to practice [everyday preventive actions](#): avoid close contact as much as possible, clean hands often; avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands; and frequently clean and disinfect surfaces.

Who Should Not Wear a Cloth Face Covering

Cloth face coverings should **not** be worn by:

- Children younger than 2 years old
- Anyone who has trouble breathing
- Anyone who is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the cloth face covering without assistance

Feasibility and Adaptations

CDC recognizes that wearing cloth face coverings may not be possible in every situation or for some people. In some situations, wearing a cloth face covering may exacerbate a physical or mental health condition, lead to a medical emergency, or introduce significant safety concerns. Adaptations and alternatives should be considered whenever possible to increase the feasibility of wearing a cloth face covering or to reduce the risk of COVID-19 spreading if it is not possible to wear one.

For example,

- People who are deaf or hard of hearing—or those who care for or interact with a person who is hearing impaired—may be unable to wear cloth face coverings if they rely on lipreading to communicate. In this situation, consider using a clear face covering. If a clear face covering isn't available, consider whether you can use written communication, use closed captioning, or decrease background noise to make communication possible while wearing a cloth face covering that blocks your lips.
- Some people, such as people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, mental health conditions or other sensory sensitivities, may have challenges wearing a cloth face covering. They should consult with their healthcare provider for advice about wearing cloth face coverings.
- Younger children (e.g., preschool or early elementary aged) may be unable to wear a cloth face covering properly, particularly for an extended period of time. Wearing of cloth face coverings may be prioritized at times when it is difficult to maintain a distance of 6 feet from others (e.g., during carpool drop off or pick up, or when standing in line at school). Ensuring proper cloth face covering size and fit and providing children with frequent reminders and education on the importance and proper wear of cloth face coverings may help address these issues.
- People should not wear cloth face coverings while engaged in activities that may cause the cloth face covering to become wet, like when [swimming at the beach or pool](#). A wet cloth face covering may make it difficult to breathe. For activities like swimming, it is particularly important to maintain physical distance from others when in the water.
- People who are engaged in high intensity activities, like running, may not be able to wear a cloth face covering if it causes difficulty breathing. If unable to wear a cloth face covering, consider conducting the activity in a location with greater ventilation and air exchange (for instance, outdoors versus indoors) and where it is possible to maintain physical distance from others.

- People who work in a setting where cloth face coverings may increase the risk of [heat-related illness](#) or cause safety concerns due to introduction of a hazard (for instance, straps getting caught in machinery) may consult with an occupational safety and health professional to determine the appropriate face covering for their setting. Outdoor workers may prioritize use of cloth face coverings when in close contact with other people, like during group travel or shift meetings, and remove face coverings when social distancing is possible. [Find more information here](#) and below.

Cloth face coverings are a critical preventive measure and are **most** essential in times when social distancing is difficult. If cloth face coverings cannot be used, make sure to take other measures to reduce the risk of COVID-19 spread, including social distancing, frequent hand washing, and cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched surfaces.

Face Shields

It is not known if face shields provide any benefit as source control to protect others from the spray of respiratory particles. CDC does not recommend use of face shields for normal everyday activities or as a substitute for cloth face coverings. Some people may choose to use a face shield when sustained close contact with other people is expected. If face shields are used without a mask, they should wrap around the sides of the wearer's face and extend to below the chin. Disposable face shields should only be worn for a single use. Reusable face shields should be cleaned and disinfected after each use. **Plastic face shields for newborns and infants are NOT recommended.**

Surgical Masks

Cloth face coverings are not surgical masks or respirators. Currently, those are critical supplies that should continue to be reserved for healthcare workers and other medical first responders, as recommended by current CDC guidance. Cloth face coverings also are not appropriate substitutes for them in workplaces where masks or respirators are recommended or required and available.
