As clergy serving faith communities in Northfield, we were honored to participate in this year's Pride in the Park celebration. We were there because of our faith not in spite of it. Our shared spiritual and moral convictions compel us to affirm the dignity, worth, and belovedness of every person, especially those who have too often been excluded from or harmed by religious institutions.
